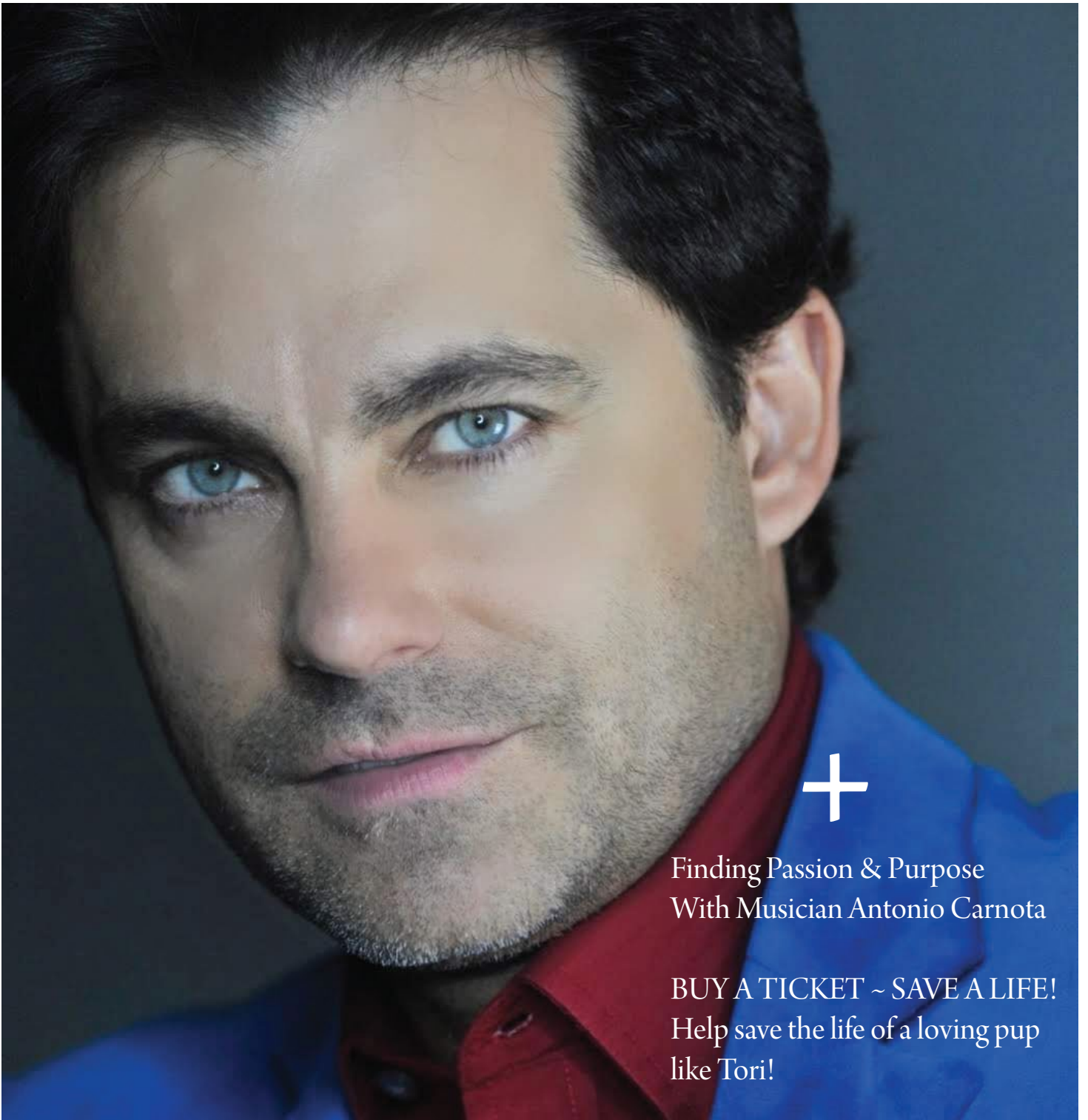

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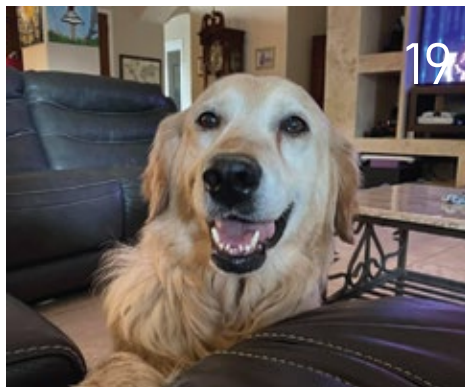


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From THE DEVELOPER

We are approaching the summer season with fewer than 13 lots remaining plus 35 lots in Phase 5 (on the top of the mountain). Once we open the 30 lots in Phase 3, there will be no lots available in MacDonald Highlands, so the message now is, if you have considered buying another view lot – do it now, or you may miss out! Do not procrastinate.

On the construction front, the new pool should be finished in mid-July and Pickle Ball court should be completed by the end of June, and the new fitness building will probably be completed closer to September. The entire facility will be repainted, and the new café will be expanded to the north. We have new spa areas to be added to the Stephanie side of the building, and these will be interesting. Aside from the beautiful massage rooms, we plan to add anti-aging, state of the art technology to assist our members in maintaining optimum health and keep looking younger. Our plan is to remake the entire building to bring it up to today's standards. The men's and women's restrooms will be reversed to facilitate our women's access through the back hallways to the new spa treatment rooms. The HOA also has plans for more Pickle Ball courts near the parking lots in the Valle Verde park.

In the main clubhouse, we should have the new open-air covered bar completed by September if the City cooperates. The new elevator will allow access to the Montrose and Grand Highlands Ballroom from the new open-air garden meeting area, which will accommodate 300 people or more.

The fall should see our club construction completed and ready for use, so I wish all of you a wonderful summer and will look forward to seeing you at the club, and do not procrastinate on the lots if you are interested.

FINDING PASSION & PURPOSE

With Musician Antonio Carnota

At a time when much of the world is in turmoil, musician Antonio Carnota says he feels deeply that it is his calling to bring joy and unity to people through music. Growing up underprivileged in a small town in Spain, Antonio says he learned firsthand the incredible power of music to uplift the human heart and soul in difficult circumstances. He shared some of what drives his passion and purpose today as he spoke with DragonRidge Communications Director Charlotte Evans on the heels of his debut performance in MacDonald Highlands.

Q For someone who is not yet familiar with your work, how would you describe yourself as an artist?

A As an artist, I treat my profession as a “gentleman,” so I always try to remain respectful of my talent, music and audiences. I have my own unique style in my arrangements and performances and people can easily relate. That gives me the ability to really connect with everyone from every walk of life.



Q What do you hope people will feel or experience when they hear you play?

A I hope they feel and experience my deep passion and desire to share love, hope and joy through my music.

Q Do you enjoy performing and composing equally?

A I'm inspired by how much music touches and connects people spiritually and emotionally. It truly is the universal language! When I compose, I'm able to express my thoughts and emotions in such a way that moves people even without the presence of words. Performing allows me to give music my interpretation and expression to inspire and entertain. Both composing and performing give me a lot of satisfaction.

Q At what age did you start to take an interest in music?

A At the age of 4, a pianist named Richard Clayderman came to Spain. My mother and grandmother saw him perform and fell in love with his music. After seeing how his performance brought them so much joy, I knew I wanted to become a pianist to bring the same joy to many people. Growing up in Spain, I dedicated a lot of my time to practicing the piano. It was a little complicated because living in the small town Galicia didn't offer many opportunities to pursue a career as a pianist.

Q Who inspired you musically along the way?

A I enjoyed classical music and was inspired by composers such as Bach, Beethoven and Mozart. In more contemporary music, I'm inspired by The Beatles and Frank Sinatra.

Q You moved to America recently. How has your experience been so far?

A I've learned a lot about different kinds of music and my experiences have helped me grow as a person. I discovered more opportunities to expand my career, but also the challenges of being in the music and entertainment industry.

Q Where have you performed in the world?

A I've performed in many countries in Europe, Mexico, Panama, and across the United States. I came to the United States with the goal of finding a Producer, Manager or Agent who would help me advance my career.



Q If there was one venue in the world where you would like to play, what would that be?

A I would love to perform at the White House.

Q Music can be a tough gig. What advice would you give to young, aspiring musicians?

A Appreciate that your talent is a God-given "gift" that you can use to make people happy. It's an awesome responsibility! Stay passionate and chase your dreams as a musician. Learn the business side of your profession and remain humble and grateful for your successes.

Q What challenges you today as an artist?

A It's always a challenge to see how I can continue to improve my performances for my current fans, while remaining fresh and relevant to attract new people to the emotions that music offers.

Q What should people to know about you that they might not think to ask?

A My family and I suffered the tragedy of my sister's death when she was only 16 and I was 19. Music helped us get through those dark times. I believe many people today are going through their own difficult times. If I can give them even a short period of joy with my music, then my God-given gift will be a blessing for others. It's what brings me the greatest pride and joy as a musician, seeing the happiness my music brings to people.

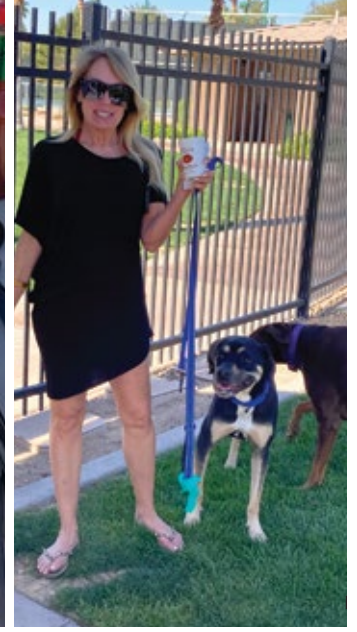

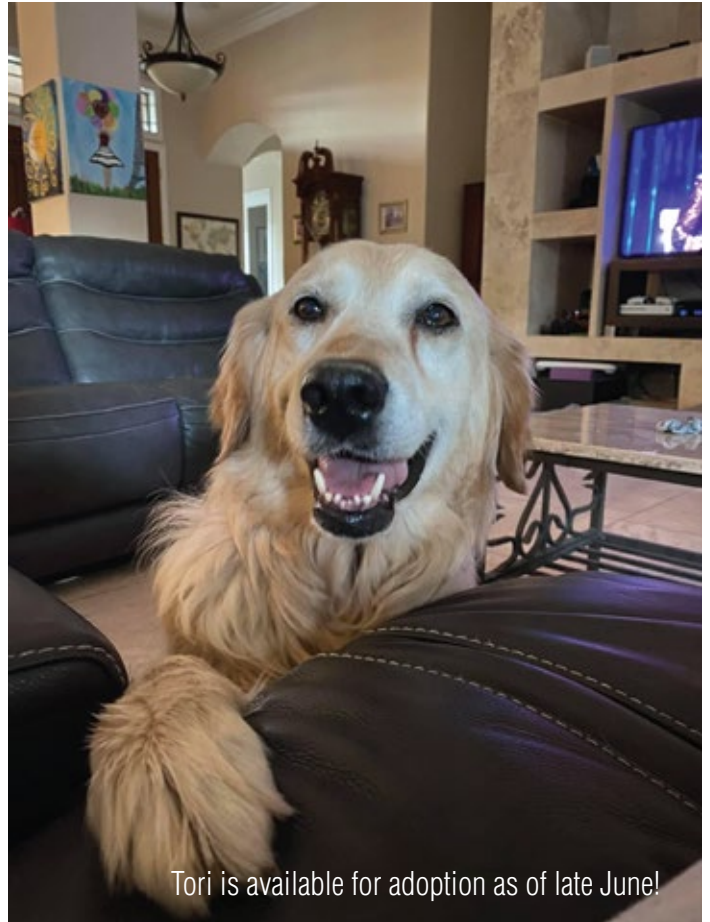

PANAMA

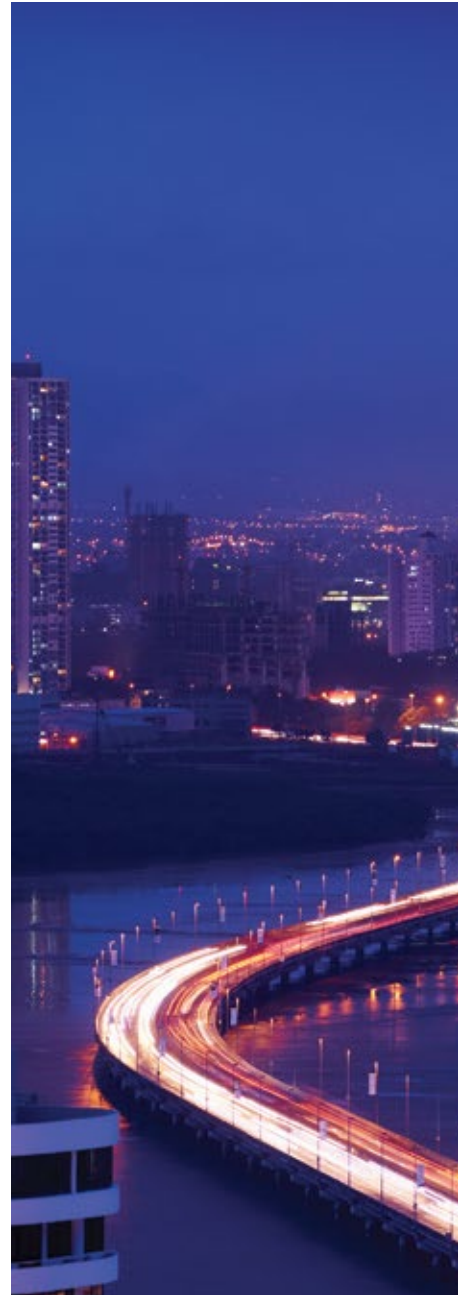
We just got back from our second trip to Panama this year. It is easy to get to, and all you need is a negative Covid test 48 hours prior to leaving. You can fly from Las Vegas to Panama City, Panama. It usually takes about 8-10 hours each way. Copa Airlines used to fly directly from Las Vegas to Panama City but stopped when Covid hit. They are hoping to start that route again around the end of this year. Cross your fingers.

Panama City is a metropolitan city of about 1.5 million people. The city is located at the Pacific entrance of the Panama Canal. It is very modern and has a lot of interesting architectural buildings. There is an old town, Casco Viejo, which is being restored and has lovely squares with parks, and restaurants. From our hotel, the taxi ride was \$3.00. We went to the old town a couple of times to restaurants. In fact, we went to one for our anniversary. It was located on the roof of the building, and the views were incredible.

Panama uses the U.S. dollar for its currency. They use 110 and 220 electricity, so you don't need adapters. It is easy to get around the City as taxis are very inexpensive. Most rides cost \$3 or \$4, or a long ride may cost you \$5. A lot

of people use Uber. There is a Metro subway system, but we haven't tried it yet. We chose a private car to pick us up at the airport. It was more expensive, but it is worth seeing that sign with your name on it and someone who knows where you want to go. We were referred to Edwin Lopez as a private driver. He spoke great English and told us about the area as we drove to the

hotel. We called him when we decided we wanted to look around for a day, and he referred us to a lady who spoke very good English, and she helped us negotiate prices while shopping.

They have great shopping in Panama City: The Multiplaza Pacific is huge with all of the known luxury brands as well as local stores. I think it is the nicest mall I have ever visited anywhere. It is so huge that it is easy to get lost. It is three stories, and the food options are great. You can even buy groceries at Reba Smith, the supermarket.

The Albrook Mall is huge, more of a local mall, and full of people, not luxurious, but you can buy everything in one place. Gifts and Panama souvenirs are 50% cheaper than in the old town.

Multicentro Mall is well located but is still recovering from the Covid problems.

The Metro mall Panama is very large and quite close to the airport. There is a shuttle service between the mall and the airport, so it is a great place to shop if you have a longer layover. There is a mix of upscale stores and regular retailers.

The City has all of the major hotel chains, which are quite nice. I was surprised when we stayed at the Intercontinental Miramar Panama, that most of the staff spoke only

Spanish. This is very common in most of the restaurants and stores. Usually, there is one person in most hotels and businesses that speaks English, but not always. As a result, Rich and I have started taking Spanish lessons.

Surprisingly there are no beaches close to the city. We drove about 2 hours west along the Pacific Ocean to Coronado, a very small retirement town mainly for ex-pats, but the beach is not white sand. I personally think it is too far from the city unless you want to just hang out there.

If you want to see more of the country, you can choose either a morning or afternoon tour from the Pacific Ocean to the Atlantic Ocean (or reverse). It about 50 miles across, and you take an air-conditioned vehicle, stopping at Fort San Lorenzo, then continue to Colon. You would then take a train back, which travels along the Panama Canal. You can also take a cruise through the Panama Canal - either a full or partial transit. Rich and I took a cruise from the Panama City side through the Miraflores Locks and back. We enjoyed it, and it was shorter than the round trip full-day canal trip.

We also went to El Valle Anton, a small town about a 2 ½ hour drive from Panama City, in the luscious green valley in an inactive volcano crater. It is the largest inhabited crater in the world. You can actually take a bus from the Albrook Terminal for just \$4.25 and be directly in the center of town in 2.5 hours. It is a beautiful little town and great for hiking. They have thermal hot springs you can relax in for \$3, and their Nispero Zoo is actually more of an animal rescue center but we really enjoyed seeing all the animals and birds there.

You can also take a tour to Monkey Island on Gatun Lake along the Panama Canal. They have a large population of monkeys and other wildlife. It is a 35-minute boat ride on the Chagres River. The tour takes about 80 minutes spent observing different species of monkeys, then a 35 minute ride back to your hotel. This is a popular tour.

Next time we go to Panama City, we want to go to Boquete. It is referred to as one of the world's best retirement destinations. The ex-pat community is well-established and extremely active. Ex-pats and locals have set up a weekly market, a small theater company, a library, and much more. It has one of the world's most perfect climates, with lows around 65F and highs barely in the 80s. It also has farm-fresh produce, award-winning coffee plantations, and the famous La Amistad natural park.

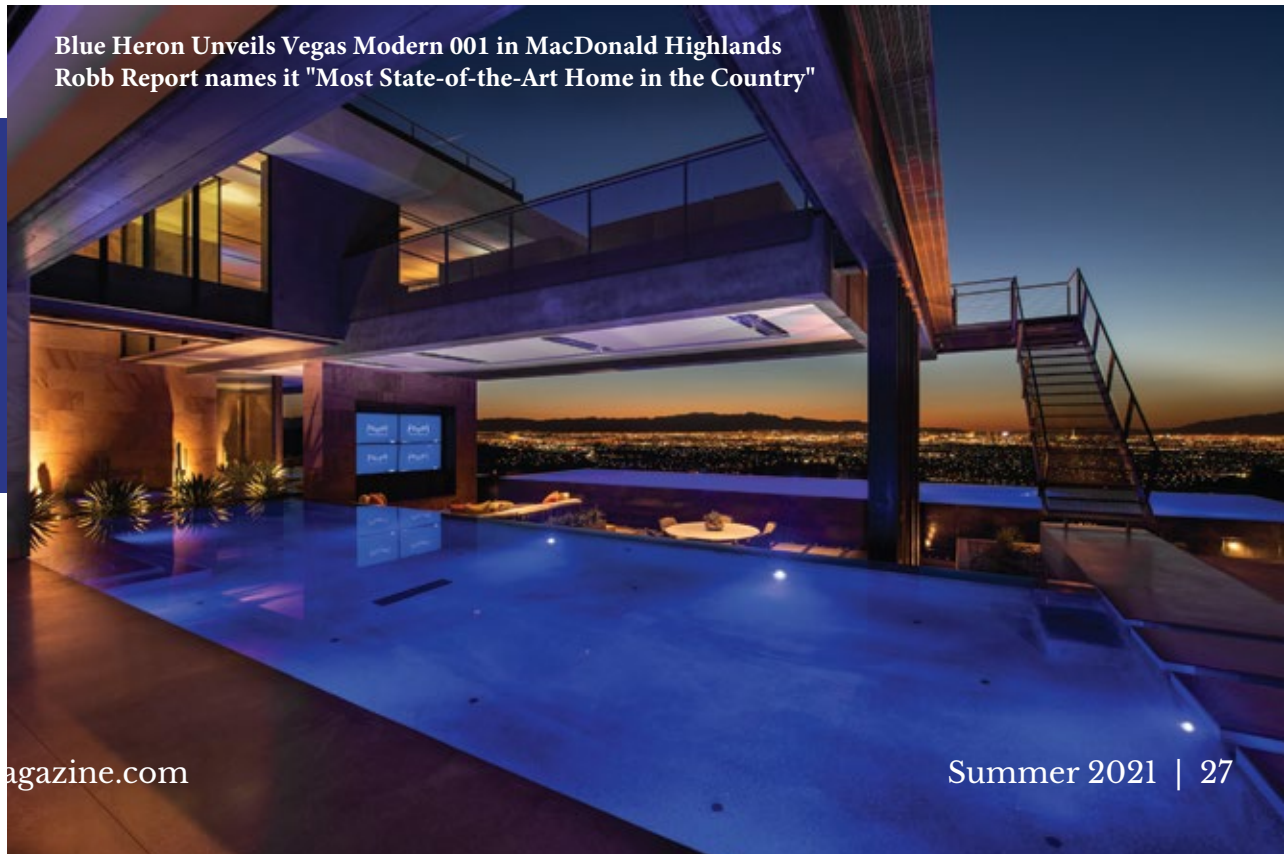
