



THE LUXURY LAS VEGAS REAL ESTATE MARKET IS STILL HOT!


As of May 2024, the luxury market in Las Vegas, Nevada has 690 luxury homes for sale, down from 727 in May 2023. This includes 601 single-family homes listed for \$1 million or more, and 89 condos and townhomes listed for the same price. 134 luxury homes have been sold, up from 114 in April 2023. The median sales price has remained at \$1,400,000, while the number of new listings has continued to outpace 2023, up 6.3% from the previous year.

As of the latest data available, there is no indication of a significant drop in home prices in the Las Vegas housing market. While median sale prices and list prices fluctuate over time, the overall trend remains relatively stable. Factors such as market demand, inventory levels, and economic conditions can influence price movements, but there is currently no evidence to suggest a widespread decline in home prices in Las Vegas. Housing prices are remaining steady and stable and leveling off, not increasing. And no, as of now, there is no definitive evidence to support the likelihood of a housing market crash in Las Vegas of any sort, and certainly not in MacDonald Highlands.







What sets tennis apart is its universal appeal. It's a sport that combines physical agility with strategic thinking, making it perfect for players of all ages and skill levels.



How does a childhood passion for tennis evolve into a lifelong journey of success and inspiration? For Adolph, it all began during a P.E. class at the age of ten, where he first discovered his love for tennis. This initial spark led him to compete in his first novice tournament, placing fourth and igniting a desire to pursue the sport further. With unwavering support from his parents and exceptional coaching, Adolph's tennis career flourished, taking him

from a young enthusiast to a collegiate player at UCLA, and eventually to a revered coach at DragonRidge Country Club. Adolph's dedication, achievements, and the legacy continues to build in the world of tennis.

His first coach was Glen Grisillo from Johannesburg, South Africa, who was featured twice in the mixed doubles main draw at Wimbledon. Glen was a collegiate tennis player for Mississippi State University on a scholarship before transferring to the University of Nevada. Once he began lessons with his new coach, Adolph quickly realized his growth. Adolph, who was also a talented baseball player, soon found tennis to be his favorite sport. He became a highly skilled, top-rated junior and was eventually recruited for college tennis.

Adolph attended UCLA as a walk-on tennis player. He earned his way onto the practice team and eventually onto the UCLA Tennis Team. Some of Adolph's biggest accomplishments include playing collegiate tennis and competing with some of the top tennis professionals in the U.S.

Adolph joined DragonRidge Country Club shortly after the club's construction began in the early 2000s. He was the Director of Tennis and Head Pro at Anthem Country Club before moving to DragonRidge in 2008. He was referred to DragonRidge by members Liz Salomone and Pat Yoseloff who believed Adolph would be a great fit for the community and club as the Director of Tennis and Head Pro. Adolph seamlessly transitioned from Anthem Country Club.

Grisillo's influence on Adolph at such a young age has inspired Adolph to be that same kind of coach. Preston is currently ranked number one in Nevada, number two in the Southwest region, and tenth overall nationally. Jordyn Hazelitt, another promising player, is currently ranked number two in Nevada, five in the Southwest region, and sixteen nationally. Sedona Gallagher, an accounting major at Arizona State University, has the highest winning percentage in doubles at the university and received a full-ride scholarship at the age of sixteen. She is ranked as high as number 95 in singles by the ITA and received an Honorable Mention to the Pac-12 All-Conference Team. Blythe Buntrock is one of the top-rated players at the University of Oklahoma, winning seventy matches in three seasons and ranking number one in the country.

Adolph takes great pride in seeing his students grow and develop as players. He coaches them at all age levels, enjoys seeing them have fun, and become successful in all walks of life. Many of his students have gone on to become not only tennis professionals but also doctors, accountants, orthopedic surgeons, and financial advisors. He believes his students are not only great tennis players but great people too.







THE MANSION TAX

Why Nevada Must Steer Clear of this Unfair Policy

Chicago successfully rejected a controversial "mansion tax," a real estate transfer tax targeting the sale of high-value properties. While this might seem like a distant concern, it's critical—especially those who desire a thriving housing market and growing successful businesses—to understand the implications of such policies and why they would be detrimental if implemented in our state.

WHAT IS THE MANSION TAX?

Chicago's purposed "mansion tax" or real estate transfer tax would have imposed 1% tax on property sales over \$1 million, meaning if you sell a property for \$1.5 million, you owe \$15,000 in taxes. And despite what the name suggests, this tax was aimed at both private and commercial property sales. Proponents argue that this tax generates essential revenue for city services, but it raises significant issues that we cannot ignore.

THE UNFAIR BURDEN ON PROPERTY OWNERS

Imagine you've worked tirelessly for years, building a successful business and investing in your dream home. Just as you're about to enjoy the fruits of your labor, you're handed an unexpected bill—a hefty tax that feels like an unfair penalty for your success.

This would have been the reality for property owners hit by the mansion tax. Those with higher-value homes are already contributing significantly through property taxes, and an additional transfer tax feels like an unnecessary burden. This type of tax also disproportionately affects those who have invested heavily in their properties, whether for personal use or as part of their business ventures.

IMPACT ON THE ECONOMY AND REAL ESTATE MARKET

Our state's appeal includes a favorable tax environment that attracts individuals and successful businesses. For Nevada, adopting a similar policy could have dire economic

consequences. Buyers aware of the additional costs may seek alternatives in more tax-friendly regions, reducing demand in the local market. Sellers might be discouraged from relocating due to the hefty tax burden on two transactions, leading to decreased

market activity and potentially lower property values.

WHY THIS TAX IS UNFAIR

At its core, the mansion tax is fundamentally unfair. It singles out a specific demographic for additional taxation, often without clear justification beyond generating revenue. This approach overlooks the broader economic contributions of these individuals, from job creation to philanthropy, and risks undermining the very foundation of our state's economic vitality.

Moreover, it sets a dangerous precedent. If we start imposing punitive taxes on high-value property sales, where does it end? The principle of fair taxation should be that everyone contributes equitably based on their ability to pay, not that specific groups are targeted for their success.

The introduction of a mansion tax, akin to what we see in Chicago, would be a step backward, undermining the very factors that make our state attractive. This is precisely why Nevada Policy exists—to keep bad policy out of our state and to ensure that Nevada remains a beacon for opportunity and success.

Supporting Nevada Policy is the best way to keep our state thriving and stop bad policy from ever seeing the light of day. By staying vigilant and proactive, we can protect our economic health and continue fostering growth and prosperity.

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
















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
